

Local Farms



Vermont farms are famous for their hospitality. With so many in the area we decided to highlight a few that have special qualities that we think you might enjoy.



Adams Family Farm: Located in beautiful Wilmington, Vermont this farm began in the mid 1800's. Offering fun for the whole family including a petting zoo, livestock barns, quilt loft, hay rides and jumps and many more activities this is surely a place you don't want to miss.

Sweet Maple Alpacas: Located in Westminster, Vermont this farm offers something a little different. Following the purchase of their first Alpaca the owners fell in love with them and now own 16 with more on the way. These sweet natured animals are as fun to visit as they are beautiful to look at. While at the farm you can also visit the sugar house and the store where you will find maple products as well as items made from the Alpaca fiber.

Chipman Stables: Located in Manchester, Vermont this farm offers horseback riding for all abilities. Why not spend the day enjoying the trails of Southern Vermont from horseback.

Green Mountain Horse Ranch: Located in Putney, Vermont this Horse ranch offers a variety of activities from trail rides to winter sleigh rides. With over 4 miles of wooded trails the ranch can accommodate riders of all skill levels.



Sugarbush Farm: Located in historic Woodstock, Vermont visitors to this farm can learn how maple trees are tapped and how syrup is made. Also known for their excellent waxed Vermont cheese this is surely a farm to enjoy.

Billings Farm and Museum: Located in Woodstock, Vermont this is, perhaps, one of Vermont's most famous farms. With exhibits following the history of farming in the area including a working dairy farm, the 1890 house which chronicles daily life in the early 19th century and many other fascinating exhibits this will be a trip to remember.

Taylor Farm: Located in nearby Lodonderry, Vermont this dairy farm produces hand crafted award winning cheeses. Stroll through the dairy barns and watch the entire cheese process from milking the cows to actually making the cheese. When you are through be sure to try the samples of Gouda that are available at the farm stand.

Vermont Wildflower Farm: Located in Charlotte, Vermont is nationally famous for their beautiful wildflowers from all over the world. On a trip to the farm you will find 6 acres of fields and forest habitat that are home to more than 250 species of wildflowers. Each species is clearly marked with its name and also fascinating Native American uses and in many cases romantic legends that are associated with the flowers. After a quiet stroll through the fields visit the store where you can find many varieties of seeds, gardening supplies and nature books.

The Apple Barn & Country Bake Shop: Located in Bennington, Vermont this farm stand offers over 30 varieties of fresh apples as well as a delicious assortment of fresh baked goods and maple products. While visiting be sure to check out Vermont' first corn maze. Follow the trails through 2 acres of corn stalks.
